The International PATHWAYS Conference will present the results and policy recommendation to support employment of people with chronic diseases in Europe

The problem: Long-term health problems constitute a greater risk of income poverty, social exclusion, severe material deprivation, and lower work intensity. Moreover, persons with longstanding health problems face higher rates of unemployment and inactivity. The rising prevalence of chronic diseases as well as the current economic crisis make the issue even more problematic, requiring actions in terms of innovative strategies to improve the participation of individuals with chronic diseases, that often experience work-related problems.

The answer: The response of EU Commission to the need for better knowledge on innovative strategies to improve participation in the labor market and to the need of having a stronger focus on reintegration or inclusion into employment, is provided by the 3-years European PATHWAYS Project- Participation To Healthy Workplaces And inclusive Strategies in the Work Sector(2015-2018). The project aimed to:

1. **IDENTIFY** INTEGRATION AND REINTEGRATION TO WORK STRATEGIES FOR PERSONS WITH CHRONIC DISEASES IN EUROPE
2. **EVALUATE** THEIR EFFECTIVENESS
3. **ASSESS** SPECIFIC EMPLOYMENT RELATED **NEEDS** OF PERSONS WITH CHRONIC DISEASES
4. TO DEVELOP **EUROPEAN POLICY GUIDELINES AND RECOMMENDATIONS** SUPPORTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF EFFECTIVE PROFESSIONAL INTEGRATION AND REINTEGRATION STRATEGIES.
